


# General Rules 2020

Deadline for quilt entries is June 1, 2020

1. Submit entry forms to: Black Canyon Quilt Show, Inc.; PO Box 2053; Montrose, CO 81402 or at your guild meeting before June 1, 2020. **PLEASE FILL OUT THE FORM COMPLETELY!!**
2. Attach a photo of your quilt to the back of the entry form. (The quilt does not have to be finished in the picture.) Photos will be used to help with pleasing color arrangement at the show.
3. Only two quilts may be entered in the same category. Quilts should not have been previously displayed at the Black Canyon show. No framed entries will be accepted.
4. All quilts must have a 4" hanging sleeve. The sleeve should be placed at the top of the quilt.
5. Cut two or three 3" squares of muslin for labels. (Please use safety pins to attach all labels.)
  - a. Print name of entrant on a square and pin to the lower left corner (when looking at the back of the quilt) **ONLY** if the entrant's name is not already included on a sewn label.
  - b. **BOLDLY** print your entry number and name on a square and pin to the top of the pillowcase the entry is delivered in. Entry numbers will be assigned as the entries are received and will be given to you by email or phone after June 1.
  - c. **BOLDLY** print your entry number on a square along with: 1) type of quilting (Long/Mid-arm, domestic machine, computer aided, or hand; **and** 2) non-professional or professional quilting. This information will match information from your entry form. Pin to the front of your quilt, lower left hand corner (when looking at the front of the quilt).

6. Liability Insurance is the sole responsibility of each quilt owner. Black Canyon Quilt Show, Inc. does not assume liability for loss or damage of any nature to your quilt. The sponsors of the Black Canyon Quilt Show will handle your quilt with the utmost care.
7. Black Canyon Quilt Show reserves the right to move your quilt to a more appropriate category.
8. Each entered item must be delivered to the Montrose Pavilion between 8:00 AM and 9:00 AM on Wednesday, July 15, 2020. Items must be in individually labeled pillowcases. Quilts will **ONLY** be released from the show between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 19, 2020. The signature of the person picking up the quilt is required during check out.

Categories	Awards
<p><b>Pieced*</b>: Quilts made from many pieces of fabric sewn together by hand or machine</p> <p><b>Mixed Techniques*</b>: Quilts that combine applique and piecing. Whole cloth, yo-yo's or fully embroidered quilts fit in this category</p> <p><b>Hand Applique</b>: Quilts with pieces of fabric which are hand sewn onto a background fabric to form a design. At least 75% of the surface is applique.</p> <p><b>Machine Applique*</b>: Quilts with pieces of fabric which are sewn or fused onto a background fabric to form a design. At least 75% of the surface is applique.</p> <p><b>Modern Quilt</b>: Functional, often bold colored quilts with minimalism, asymmetry, expansive negative space, and/or alternate grid work.</p> <p><b>Art Quilt</b>: Layered fibers of original pattern incorporating experimentation with textile manipulation, color, texture, and/or a diversity of mixed media. All work must be completed by one person.</p> <p><b>Kit</b>: A quilt of any technique where the pattern and fabrics were purchased as a unit to then be assembled</p> <p><b>Group Quilt</b>: Quilts made by 3 or more people, any technique</p> <p><b>Challenge</b>: Theme "Silver Threads" Some silver must be used (fabric, quilting, threads or embellishments). Perimeter not more than 120". All work must be completed by one person.</p> <p><b>Youth</b>: Age 18 or younger. Top must be constructed by the youth.</p> <p><b>*Quilts in these categories will be judged in groups based on quilt size and the number of entrants in each category. Small – up to 120" perimeter; Medium – 121" to 260" perimeter; Large – 261" to 480"</b></p>	<p>For each category, there may be 3 ribbons awarded by the judges: <b>1<sup>st</sup></b>, <b>2<sup>nd</sup></b> and <b>3<sup>rd</sup></b> place. The judges may present special awards for:</p> <p><b>Best of Show</b></p> <p><b>Best New Quilter</b></p> <p><b>Best Machine Quilting – Non-Professional</b></p> <p><b>Best Machine Quilting – Professional</b>: Professional means the quilt has been quilted by one who quilts for any means of gain.</p> <p><b>Best Computer Aided Quilting-Professional</b></p> <p><b>Best Computer Aided Quilting-Non-Professional</b></p> <p><b>Best Domestic Machine Quilting</b></p> <p><b>Best Hand Quilting</b></p> <p><b>Judge's Choice</b>: judge (s) will select a favorite quilt.</p> <p><b>CQC or NACQA Award of Excellence</b></p> <p><b>President's Choice</b> – President will select a favorite quilt</p> <p><b>Viewer's Choice</b>: This will be chosen by the viewers during the show.</p> <p><b>Mayor's Choice</b>: Montrose mayor's favorite quilt.</p> <p><b>MCA Choice</b>: Montrose Center for the Arts favorite quilt.</p> <p><b>Youth</b> are encouraged to have their quilts judged. Ribbons will be given for participation in the show.</p> <p><b>Quilts by nationally recognized quilters are welcome for exhibit but will not be judged.</b></p>
