April 25: OH Baby! Baby! Baby! So many baby-themes and baby-items to choose from: Blankets, bibs, booties, diaper bags, or baby animal prints, baby toy prints...... you get the idea! The Color of the Month is **Lavender** or **Purple**. Our program is sure to be a VERY informative presentation about the do's and don'ts related to preparing your quilt to be quilted by a long arm professional. This is a **don't miss** program if you have ever, or ever hope to engage a long-armer to finish your quilt.

....and...there will be CAKE! Friendship Quilters of Western Colorado celebrates 31 years as a Guild this month. Happy Birthday FQWC!

May 23: By the Merry Month of May, there should be lots of FLOWERS to enjoy – especially at our May 23 meeting as <u>Flowers/Florals</u> are the focus for projects this month. Wear your favorite BLUE outfit for another doorprize participation ticket in May!

The program spotlight in May will focus on an historic quilting technique called *English Paper Piecing*. This technique is centuries old and most typically involves hexagon shapes carefully sewn together to create intricate patterns. We'll have a live demonstration by one (or maybe more!) of our resident experts and you will have a chance to try this technique yourself! Bring a needle, thread and a little scissor/snip and we'll get started on our very own "hexi" keepsake. In keeping with the "antique" idea, we would like you to bring any "old", "antique" or "vintage" quilts you may have. We'll have a special show-and-share to honor those time-worn beauties!

June 27: Sunny YELLOW is our Color of the Month and <u>Bubbles, Circles, Yo-Yo</u>'s is our project Theme. Practice your "bubble" free-motion quilting skills, finish up your "Wonky Circles" project from Ami's March class or bring something you've made with Yo-Yo's! This is sure to be a fun meeting! Our program presenter will be Caroline Ellerman, a "snow-bird" Guild member who resides in Arizona during the cold season. She'll be back to give us her insight into The World of Quilt Judging Today as she is currently in training to be a Certified Quilt Judge. Caroline's extensive travels have expanded her knowledge about quilting techniques used across the globe.

Keep those Log Cabins coming!

The Log Cabin blocks hit a slow-down in March with just 15 blocks turned in. Our count is now at 73. Keep them coming! They're easy and fast and you can use up some of those ever-present SCRAPS! These blocks should start with a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " RED center and be sewn with <u>a definite light side</u>, and a definite dark side of random width strips. They should be trimmed to 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " before you turn them in.

Wild and Goosey Update

Following Cyndi Holman's March demonstration on creating the adorable Wild and Goosey paper pieced blocks, we should have a FLOCK of these Geese arriving in our collection box in April! These little gems are perfect for really tiny scraps - you know you have them! Remember to trim the blocks and—please: tear off the paper before you drop them into the bin.

Delectable Mountain Table Runner Guild Fundraiser Class.

Bring your lunch and join us after the May Friendship Quilters Guild meeting for a fun fundraising class. Ami Krenzel will teach you how to make a simple Delectable Mountains block into a fun table runner or small wall quilt. These would make great ,quick gifts. You will need a sewing machine and basic sewing supplies as well as 12 precut fabric squares. A complete supply list will be available at the April meeting. Cost \$10.00 as part of our fundraising plan.



Ami Krenzel pieced and quilted this quilt called Elyse's Garden.




Library

What's in the Friendship Library?



Fabric Leftovers: simple, adaptable ways to use up scraps by D'Arcy-Jean Milne is a fun book which unites quick quilting and crafting projects, leaving lots of room for personal creativity. Tips for storage and processing of scraps are offered. The author encourages the construction of larger pieces of fabric with embellishments for use in items such as journal covers, wallets, bags of all sorts and photo frames. One can also learn to make ruched flowers, button flowers, tassels, decorative cording, fabric bowls, hair scrunchies and assorted beads. Several actual patterns are provided, along with dimensions and instructions for other projects. –Karla Gilbert
