The finished quilt must have three layers, must be quilted or tied, and edges must be finished. The quilts will be presented at the October meeting. Note ... neutral colors are defined as colors that lack saturation and create a restful effect.

<u>September 26</u> - We will meet in Friendship Hall this month! Our Color of the Month and Project Theme this month is FALL THEMES – wear your favorite fall color and bring those gorgeous autumn-themed quilts!!! Kim Lindel will keep the fall feeling going through her program on using fabric scraps to create gorgeous fall décor pieces. We will also have a representative from Dolphin House speak to us about the services they provide in our community in anticipation of the Quilt and Toy Parade in November.

<u>October 24</u> – Color of the month: ORANGE. Project Theme: Pumpkins or Halloween (of course)! Turn in your Guild Challenge project: "Churn it Up". Remember, this is NOT a contest with voting or prizes, but it should reveal the creativity that runs rampant in our group! See additional information elsewhere in the newsletter for details on the Challenge.

After the Challenge Reveal, we'll play a fun game; you'll need to bring 10-12 strips of fabric (any color will do) that are 2 ½" wide X WOF (42"±) Be ready for some giggles!

<u>November 21</u>: November is Native American Heritage Month so our Color of the Month is TURQUOISE and we'd love to see your Native American Theme projects during the "regular" Showand-Share time. The highlight of the day will once again feature a "Quilt and Toy" Parade. Pair your quilt (any size) with a coordinating toy to be donated to children (any age) of families served by Dolphin House Child Advocacy Center. This has become a favorite Guild tradition that supports this important Community Resource. Be sure to stay for the Parade – it is ALWAYS amazing!!

Keep those Log Cabin blocks coming!

We've collected 139 log Cabin blocks so far. Keep them coming so we can make at least 2 beautiful quilts in 2025! They're easy and fast and you can use up some of those ever-present SCRAPS! These blocks start with a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " RED center and are sewn with <u>a definite light side</u>, and a definite dark side of random width strips. They should be trimmed to 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " before you turn them in.

Wild and Goosey Flock Count

Our Goose flock count is up to 60, but it will take a LOT more of these little paper pieced blocks to make a quilt! These little gems are perfect for those really tiny scraps! Remember to trim the blocks and—please tear off the paper before you drop them into the bin. Pattern is again attached to this newsletter so you can print off a few copies and get to sewing!!

The pattern in on page 6. Be sure to check the gauge and adjust as needed.

"Hands On Program" During September 26th Guild Meeting Fall Fabrics to Make Fabulous Fall Decor

Happy September Everyone,

I am teaching a class on how to use your Fall fabrics to make fabulous Fall Decor. I will have plenty of fabric to pick from. There will be many projects to choose from: Please bring scissors and a glue gun if you have one.

Easter Egg Acorns Fall Bunting Fall wrapped pumpkins Fabric folded pumpkins- this is like the spiral ornament that Carolyn Ray taught a few months ago but, this one will be pumpkin shaped. I have the styrofoam pumpkins.

You need to cut two strong contrasting but complimentary colors.

-40 2x 3 1/2 rectangles color 1

- 36 2X 3 1/2 rectangles color 2
- 1 2 1/2 x 2 1/2 square
- 325 plus straight pins
- measuring tape

It should be a lot of fun See you on the 26th

Nice to bring (if you have them): Add-a-Quarter" or "Add-an-Eighth" ruler, pinking shears




For those of you who stepped out of your comfort zone and left your blocks on the table in August, thank you! Patty Heath combined them to create this adorable child's quilt pictured to the right.



What's in the Friendship Library?

Are you having fun with the "Churning It Up" fall challenge? Maybe it's time now to expand your creativity under the tutelage of Joen Wolfrom through her book, *Patchwork Persuasion*. The book is a resource for quilters who are looking for ways to create unique quilts based on traditional block patterns. Through the book one can explore ways to enhance a quilt's interest and beauty through block play. Change blocks by adding or eliminating design lines, removing block sections, rotating, staggering or floating blocks. Stretch, squeeze, or blend them, too.

Detailed explanations, numerous colored diagrams, and beautiful quilt photos make one want to try out some of Joen's methods, even if they are simply done with small paper blocks as she suggests for placement experimentation before actually cutting into fabric.

I've got some new ideas for a collection of maple leaf blocks now!

Did you know.....

The Churn Dash is a very old 9-Patch quilt block pattern, originating between 1800 and 1849! Its name is a result of the resemblance of the triangle and rectangle perimeter of the block to a butter churn and the center square to the stick (or "dash") of the butter churn.
