FALL Landscape Confetti Art Quilt Program by Judith Kennedy October 5, 2024

This is a fun art project that embraces ART. In a Confetti Art Quilt, I use the fabric and threads as a paint brush. This technique is unique and will expand your use for the home "Stash" and brain "Creativity". This technique can be used as the whole art quilt or with mixed media projects. Confetti uses One to Three background fabric, then multiple fabrics including yellow, gold, blue, green, brown and red.

Material and Tools List

1. Bring your own picture/pattern of a landscape, (landscape picture of your own to use as reference for your design for lines and color.) Think of Fall Trees. Approximately 81/2 x 11inch. KEEP IT SIMPLE. Please have it traced, you will making another tracing of your picture during the class.

2. Fabrics that will complement your design. Think of 3-4 different values; very light,

light, medium, and dark. also threads or yarns. Do not cut up any of your fabric Please bring a Fat Qtr. of Black for backing, any quality. (You will finish your art quilt at home on your machine)

- 3. White marking pencil and a pencil to trace with.
- 4. Fine scissors, rotary cutter and small cutting mat , chalk , a tracing wheel
- 5. stiletto, tweezers, and Long straight pins preferred.

6. Stabilizing pad to hold our designs in place, such as a large piece of flat

styrofoam or a square ironing pad. Also a box bottom, or a shirt box

to carry your project home, flat & safely on your stabilizing pad.

I will be providing black or white felt for each person and, black or white tracing paper and the tulle There will be a \$3.00 charge for the supplies that I provide.
