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## Welcome, Appraisal Clients!

Thank you for treasuring your quilts enough to find out more about them. I've been appraising since 1997, certified by the American Quilter's Society since 1999, and a member of the American Society of Appraisers (ASA) for more than eleven years. My other qualifications will be on your report – but feel free to request it beforehand, or e-mail/phone with other questions. Here are some of the questions I will be asking you during the course of the appraisal. To help things go more smoothly, take a minute to jot notes on this worksheet, front and back. Then bring it to your appointment.

**NAME/ADDRESS INFO** (full name, including birth name, married names, etc. Address, phone (inc. cell phone), e-mail address, connected website, if you have one.).

**Purpose of the Appraisal:** Insurance value (if you want it valued in case of problems) (check one)

Donation value (if you plan to donate it in the next year)

**Information about the quilt and/or quiltmaker:** (Family info? Quilter's full name, where lived, birth/death?) **If you are the quiltmaker, please put your full birth date, plus place where born.** Does family history (or you) assign this quilt to a date or specific event?

Was a commercial pattern, book or other source used to make this piece? (If you know)

**Batting Used:** (if you know)

Any other info about techniques and materials used, including (circle):

\*machine or hand pieced? \*machine or hand appliqued? machine or hand quilted?

Any unusual features? (examples: scalloped or prairie point binding – or piping) What should I know about this piece that makes it special to you?
