- The 2025 raffle quilt has been quilted. It's a stunner! A photograph of the quilt will soon be on the BCQS website. www.blackcanyonguiltshow.com
- The 2026 raffle quilt pattern has been selected, fabric has been purchased, and a schedule is being drafted for the piecing and appliqué.
- Signups are underway for the classes and lecture offered by Jean Impey for the 2025 show. You can sign up on the BCQS website.
- A tentative contract with Charisma Horton for the 2026 show has been signed pending confirmation of the show dates.

The show is a tremendous effort, created by and set up entirely by volunteers. There are numerous areas that require financial support beyond the income derived from entry fees. Keeping a portion of the proceeds will enable the show to pay its bills and continue presenting the excellent show BCQS has been through the years.





Susan explains her method of storing Jelly Roll strips and working with strips from different fabric lines. She sorts the strips by color rather than keeping the purchased sets intact so she can draw upon whatever colors she wants for a project,
