February Fabulous Fat Quarters

It is amazing what can be done with as little as one 12X21 piece of fabric or as quilters call it a Fat Quarter. Stay after February's meeting and see what can be done with little as one Fat Quarter. Bring 3 different fat quarters pressed to see how they turn into Fox or Raccoon pot holders. With as little as one fat quarter 3 or 4 key rings can be made. I will have examples and a hand out for ideas on using fat quarters. Please bring:

- 1-3 pressed fat quarters
- Scissors/ fabric and paper
- Template material (cardboard, manilla fold or clear plastic)
- 3 pieces of at least 9X9 batting
- I will provide:
- Fusible Web
- felt (for key ring)
- Cutting Mat

Remembering Founding Member

Sue Peters, a former, long time member, passed away in March of 2024. She was one of the first "founding members" to sign the attendance register in January/February of 1993 for what soon became Friendship Quilters of Western Colorado. At that time the group met at the Quilt Cellar in Ouray. When the group's first coordinator moved away in March, Sue stepped in to serve first as coordinator, then president: April 1993—May 1994, May 1994—April 1995. She was again president of the Guild from January 1, 2007—December 2007. For many years Sue was the Newsletter Editor and collected boxes of information for the Friendship scrapbook. She also photographed all the quilts displayed during Show and Tell. In addition, Sue was an active participant on the Black Canyon Quilt Show Board and an avid quilter.

She was preceded in death by her mother, Verna Painter (also a quilter), daughter Sheri Hillier, and husband Jerry Peters.



BLACK CANYON QUILT SHOW NEWS

Tickets are now on sale for the 2025 raffle quilt. They may be purchased online at the Black Canyon Quilt Show website (www.blackcanyonquiltshow.com). Austin and Carolyn Ray have tickets you may check out to sell or purchase.

Signups are underway for the classes and lecture offered by Jean Impey for the 2025 show. You can sign up on the BCQS website. She's offering a fun workshop on faces for the all-day Friday class, and raw-edge appliqué for the Saturday morning ½ day class. She'll also be doing a trunk show and lecture Saturday afternoon.

Show dates for 2026 are set! Judging will be July 8, then set up on July 9. The actual show will be July 10, 11, and 12.

Charisma Horton was selected to be the teacher for the 2026 show. You are encouraged to check out her Instagram account so you can see the types of work she does. If you're interested in hearing an interview with Charisma, she's the featured quilter in Episode 169 of the podcast "The Quilter on Fire."

The theme for the 2025 Show will be **Stars of the Black Canyon**.

The theme for the 2025 Challenge will be **Starstruck**:

• The quilt shall have at least 3 stars, and there shall be at least 3 different sizes of stars.

The 2025 raffle quilt shall be named Aspiring Stars.

WHAT'S IN THE FRIENDSHIP LIBRARY?



Lissa Alexander's *Sisterhood of Scraps* is a collection of 12 brilliant scrap quilts from seven designers. Lissa reached out to six quilters whose quilt designs she had long admired (Susan Ache, Kim Brackett, Barbara Brackman, Sheryl Johnson, Sandy Klop, and Laurie Simpson) to invite them to join her in a kind of "scrap quilt challenge." For each of the quilters contributing to her book, Lissa chose a theme or patchwork shape that both she and a participant could use in their own ways to make two related but very different scrap quilts. Detailed cutting and piecing instructions are provided for each of the gorgeous quilts. Biographical information about each quilt maker is included. Readers will also discover Lissa's definition of sisterhood.

The meeting was called to order by Cyndi Holman, at 9:32 a.m. 51 members present. Guests included:

Minutes approved, by the members, for December 2024.

Treasurer Report:

- 1. A memorial donation to the Montrose Center for the Arts was given in Kari Raish's name.
- 2. Currently have 3 paid advertisers and 40 paid members.
- 3. To date, the Scholarship Fund donations are \$320. The annual scholarship gift is \$1,000.
- 4. Event Center rental is paid from January to May.

General Announcements:

- 1. The Scholarship team is led by Trish Knostman. Additional volunteers are needed. Margie Kramer volunteered to work on the Scholarship team.
- 2. Funding idea: Bonnie Bucknam sought feedback from the members if they were interested in having "vendor" tables at meetings. The suggestion is for members to be the vendors, selling handmade items. The cost of the table is \$10 per meeting. Two tables would be available per meeting. Those interested would sign up for specific months. The vendor tables would only be open to members before and after the meeting, as well as during snack. By a raise of hands, 4-6 members were interested in being vendors and most of the members expressed that "it's a great idea!"
- 3. Ami Krenzel is leading in the creation of a beautiful raffle quilt. It has a basket and starts. She is looking for volunteers to help with the applique.

 - b. After the March guild meeting, there will be an open sew. It's a great time to make donation quilts or finish your project.
- 2. "Give It a Try" projects are created and led by Kim Lindel:
 - a. January, make Valentine gnomes
 - b. February ideas to use fat quarters
- 3. Our Historian and Librarian is Karla Gilbert:
 - a. She shared an updated list of books to borrow from the Friendship Guild Library.
 - b. New books purchased in 2024 are listed in red print.
- 4. Hospitality is led by Cathy Romaniello:
 - a. She thanked the volunteers for helping at the greeters table and with snacks.
