Remembering Founding Member

Sue Peters, a former, long time member, passed away in March of 2024. She was one of the first "founding members" to sign the attendance register in January/February of 1993 for what soon became Friendship Quilters of Western Colorado. At that time the group met at the Quilt Cellar in Ouray. When the group's first coordinator moved away in March, Sue stepped in to serve first as coordinator, then president: April 1993—May 1994, May 1994—April 1995. She was again president of the Guild from January 1, 2007—December 2007. For many years Sue was the Newsletter Editor and collected boxes of information for the Friendship scrapbook. She also photographed all the quilts displayed during Show and Tell. In addition, Sue was an active participant on the Black Canyon Quilt Show Board and an avid quilter.

She was preceded in death by her mother, Verna Painter (also a quilter), daughter Sheri Hillier, and husband Jerry Peters.

WHAT'S IN THE FRIENDSHIP LIBRARY?



Do you want to learn to quilt your own projects on your domestic sewing machine? Except for practice time, renowned teacher and quilter, Harriet Hargrave, provides virtually everything you need to know in her Heirloom Machine Quilting book which has undergone several revisions and sold thousands of copies. An older book, yes, but it's a classic "keeper." Gain useful knowledge about workspace arrangement and equipment, layering a quilt, choosing a quilting design and making it fit the space, marking quilts, doing free motion quilting, perfecting straight line quilting with a walking foot, among other topics. If Harriet tells you to do something, such as have the grainline of the top, batting and backing run in the same direction, she tells you why. Practice activities are suggested. A section of the book contains continuous line quilting patterns which can be copied for use. Harriet's goal is to make YOU a successful quilter. Two copies are in the library.
