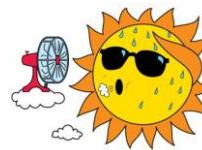

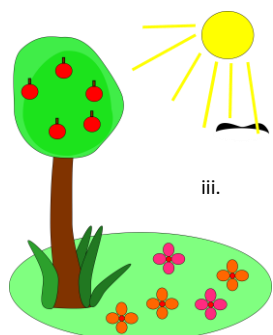


### General Business:

    - ii. May – 5x5x5 – Five members, Month of May (5), and 5 minutes to share about their quilting journey. Margaret led the interviews with the question, "Why do I quilt?"
      1. Margie Kramer and Mary Terpstra are neighbors, friends, and quilters. They have shared many life experiences and are making "created with love" quilts and sewing projects.
      2. Margie "can't draw" and wanted a creative outlet. After years of sewing and work, she started quilting 6 years ago.
      3. Mary learned to sew on a treadle machine! Her mother taught her to sew clothing that fit, when tall and petite clothing was never heard of. Mary enjoys the sisterhood bond she has with Margie and other quilters.

- d. Sales were before the meeting (8:30), at snack, and after the meeting.

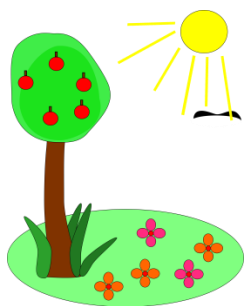
**3. Announcements:**

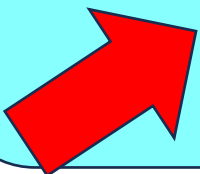
## Black Canyon Quilt Show 2026

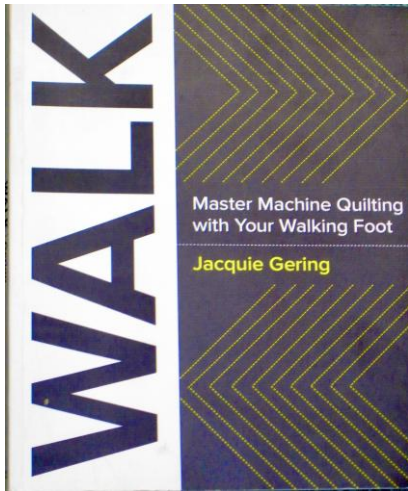

## What's in the Library?

**WALK**, by Jacquie Gering, is designed to help domestic machine quilters master the art of quilting with a walking foot. The author stresses that the walking foot is intended for “walking, not running.” She shows how to set up your sewing space for working with quilts of all sizes, provides useful information about walking feet and marking tools. Jacquie is an advocate of spray basting so one does not have to contend with pins getting in the way and provides a tutorial on how to do it with much more information than a spray can label offers. Yes, the walking foot is generally used for straight lines, but oh what elegant designs can be created just using lines and the examples in the book. Gentle curve work and use of decorative machine stitches are also covered. The very end of the book contains a useful resource guide.
