August Program:

Jan Vanderweist – Retired owner of Quilters Cottage presents:

Telling Your Story in Fabric: Labels can provide a permanent record for your family, genealogists, and museum curators. Every label should include:

- a. Your name and signature
- b. When it was made
- c. Title of the quilt
- d. Name of square
- e. Who the quilt was made for
- f. Any special information or story about the quilt, quilter, or recipient is an appreciated bonus



1. If using muslin, ALWAYS prewash it and be sure to sew the label to the quilt. No iron on.
2. For writing, use permanent ink pens, permanent paint, or embroidery with thread.

Verna Mullett – Ribbon Winner!

A review of the “Dear Jane” quilt. Verna shared about the multiple techniques used, including hand applique, quilting, and design matching on the back of the quilt. Each square was made individually, using civil war style fabrics. She received the Judges Merit Award for Excellence.

“Laurel Ridge Quilt” was created from a Rickie Tims class. Glenda Davis provided the quilting expertise.

Debbie Martinez – Self-taught long arm quilter and ribbon winner 2026

She has been quilting for 5-6 years. The ladies in her family taught her. Since 2023, Debbie has been developing her long arm skills. Her award-winning quilt was from a kit. She uses a computer program to put her design ideas directly on the quilt photo. She quilts section by section and frequently changes the color of the thread. She works 5 – 10 hours a day designing, preparing the quilt top for the long arm, and custom quilting. The process takes over 2 weeks per quilt.

Denise Betts – Self-taught free motion quilter.

“Quilted Hugs” are wraps with pockets designed for the cancer center. Patients receiving infusions often are cold. The nurses helped with the design.

Wraps are 66” across to include the neck and arms. The back is flannel. 3 ½ yards are needed and must be prewashed BEFORE THE SEPTEMBER MEETING SEW-IN. No batting is needed.

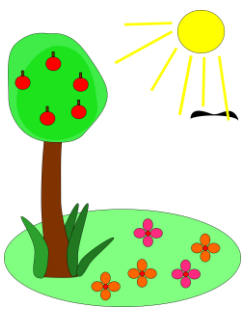


Hello,

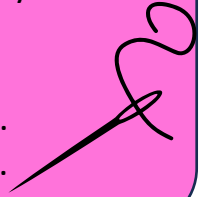

In 2008, on a Nancy Crow Textile Tour of Guatemala, the group visited an orphanage in the village of Santa Apolonia, near Solola. That visit inspired Bonnie to make bed quilts for the children who lived there. Over the next 3 years, Bonnie and friends worked on the "Guatemala Bound" project. In 2012, they delivered the last of 100 quilts to the orphanage. From 2012 – 2018 they sent another 200+ quilts to Mayan Families' Children in Need program in Panajachel, Guatemala. Bonnie's program will highlight the quilts and the exquisite textile crafts of Guatemala.

What's in the Library?

Panel quilts seem to be all the rage. If you are new to this trend or have panels you can't decide what to do with, ***Learn to Quilt With Panels*** by Carolyn S. Vagts may help you out. Carolyn says panels have endless possibilities if you use your imagination. Panels are great for bed quilts, baby quilts, lap quilts and wall hangings. Because panels and their accompanying fabric collections are constantly changing, the book presents guidelines for using them, rather than actual patterns, so any quilt you create will be uniquely yours. Some panels are designed to be used as a center focal point while others are intended for project elements. The author shows numerous possible layouts and teaches the use of graph paper for designing creative layouts. The book provides several sizes of copyable graph papers and guides readers through their use in designing personal layouts. In addition to general tips and instructions, numerous quilt photos are shown for inspiration.

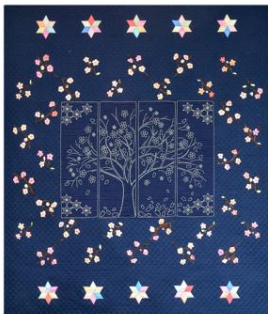

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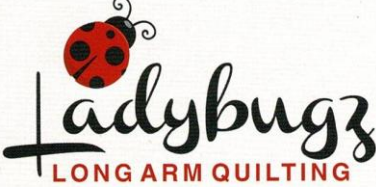
